

## Instructions

Safety Notes Please read the following Safety Notes carefully before working with the product. The Notes include important safety information about installation, usage, and maintenance.

- Always connect the product to a GFI (ground fault interrupter) circuit to avoid the risk of electrocution.
- Always disconnect the product from the power source before cleaning.
- Avoid direct eye exposure to the light source while the product is on.




- Make sure the power cord is not crimped or damaged.
- Never disconnect the product from power cord by pulling or tugging on the cord.
- If mounting the product overhead, always secure to a fastening device using a safety cable.
- Make sure there are no flammable materials close to the product when operating.
- Do not touch the product's housing when operating because it may be very hot.
- Always make sure that the voltage of the outlet to which you are connecting the product is within the range stated on the decal or rear panel of the product.
- The product is for indoor or outdoor use (IP65). Do not submerge the product.
- Always install the product in a location with adequate ventilation, at least 20 in (50 cm) from adjacent surfaces.
- Never connect the product to a dimmer.
- Never carry the product from the power cord or any moving part. Always use the hanging/mounting bracket or the handles.
- The maximum ambient temperature (Ta) is 104° F (40° C). Do not operate the product at higher temperatures.
- In the event of a serious operating problem, stop using the product immediately.
- Never try to repair the product. Repairs carried out by unskilled people can lead to damage or malfunction. Please contact the nearest authorized technical assistance center.







### 3. SETUP

AC Power The SlimPAR™ 56 IRC IP has an auto-ranging power supply and it can work with an input voltage range of 100~240 VAC, 50/60 Hz.

> To determine the product's power requirements (circuit breaker, power outlet, and wiring), use the current value listed on the label affixed to the product's back panel, or refer to the product's specifications chart. The listed current rating indicates the product's average current draw under normal conditions.



Always connect the product to a GFI protected circuit (circuit breaker or fuse). Make sure the product has an appropriate electrical ground to avoid the risk of electrocution or fire.



Never connect the product to a rheostat (variable resistor) or dimmer circuit, even if the rheostat or dimmer channel serves only as a 0 to 100% switch.

### **Power Linking**

The product provides a power linking option via the pigtails located on the back of the

You can daisy chain up to 49 units on 120 VAC or up to 80 units on 230 VAC.

If you choose not to use the power linking feature, be sure to use the included screw on cap to prevent any water from getting into the power cords.




The power linking information above corresponds to the North American version of the product ONLY! If using the product in other markets, you must consult with the local CHAUVET® distributor as power linking connectors and requirements may differ in your country or region.

Mounting Before mounting the product, read and follow the safety recommendations indicated in the Safety Notes.

Orientation The SlimPAR™ 56 IRC IP may be mounted in any position; however, make sure adequate ventilation is provided around the product.

### Rigging •

- Before deciding on a location for the product, always make sure there is easy access to the product for maintenance and programming purposes.
- Make sure that the structure onto which you are mounting the product can support the product's weight. Please see the Technical Specifications section of this manual for weight information.
- When mounting the product overhead, always use a safety cable. Mount the product securely to a rigging point, whether an elevated platform or a truss.
- When rigging the product onto a truss, you should use a mounting clamp of appropriate weight capacity. The bracket has a 13 mm hole, which is appropriate for this purpose.
- When power linking multiple products, you must always consider the length of the power linking cable and mount the products close enough for the cable to reach.
- The bracket adjustment knobs allow for directional adjustment when aiming the product to the desired angle. Only loosen or tighten the bracket knobs manually. Using tools could damage the knobs.
- The double bracket yoke also serves as floor supports. When mounting the product on the floor, make sure that the product and cables are away from people and vehicles.

## 4. OPERATION

**Control Panel**Operation

To access the control panel functions, use the four buttons located underneath the display. Please refer to the Product Overview to see the button locations on the control panel.

Button	Function
<menu></menu>	Press to find an operation mode or to back out of the current menu option
<up></up>	Press to scroll up the list of options or to find a higher value
<down></down>	Press to scroll down the list of options or to find a lower value
<enter></enter>	Press to activate a menu option or a selected value

**Configuration** Set the product in DMX mode to control with a DMX controller.

- Connect the product to a suitable power outlet.
- Turn the product on.
- Connect a DMX cable from the DMX output of the DMX controller to the DMX input socket on the product.

### **Personalities** and Starting Address

DMX The SlimPAR™ 56 IRC IP has two DMX personalities, a 3-channel mode for basic control and a 7-channel mode with more advanced control over the lights.

The SlimPAR™ 56 IRC IP uses up to 7 DMX channels in its 7-channel DMX mode, which defines the highest configurable address to 506.

When selecting a starting DMX address, always consider the number of DMX channels the selected DMX mode uses. If you choose a starting address that is too high, you could restrict the access to some of the product's channels.

If you are not familiar with the DMX protocol, you may refer to the DMX Primer at www.chauvetlighting.com.

To select the DMX personality, do the following:

- Press <MENU> repeatedly until 3-CH or 7CH shows on the display.
- Press **<ENTER>** to choose your DMX personality when it appears on the display.

To then choose your starting address:

- The display should show d001 once you've selected your DMX personality using the steps above.
- 2. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to select the starting address.
- 3. Press <ENTER>.

## (Standalone)

**Configuration** Set the product in one of the standalone modes to control without a DMX controller.

- Connect the product to a suitable power outlet.
- 2. Turn the product on.



Never connect a product that is operating in any standalone mode to a DMX string connected to a DMX controller. Products in standalone mode may transmit DMX signals that could interfere with the DMX signals from the controller.

**Static Color Mode** To enable the Static Color Mode, do the following:

- 1. Press **<MENU>** repeatedly until **C--** shows on the display.
- 2. Press <ENTER>.
- Use <UP> or <DOWN> to choose a color (C1-C7).
- 4. Press <ENTER>.

Automatic Mode To enable the Automatic Mode, follow the instructions below:

- 1. Press <MENU> repeatedly until P-- shows on the display.
- Press <ENTER>.
- 3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to choose your auto program (**P1-P4**).
- 4. Press <ENTER>.

You can adjust the speed of the automatic program as well.

- 1. Press <MENU> repeatedly until S-- shows on the display.
- Press <ENTER>.
- 3. Use **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to adjust the duration of each step of the automatic program from S001 (slow) to S100 (fast).
- Press <ENTER>.

Custom Static To enable the Custom Static Color Mode:

- Color Mode 1. Press <MENU> repeatedly until U-- shows on the display.
  - Press **<ENTER>** to choose between colors (r--, g--, b--).
  - Press **<UP>** or **<DOWN>** to choose the intensity of the color (**r000-100**).
  - 4. Repeat the steps to mix additional colors to create the color you need.
  - Press < ENTER >.

Master/Slave The Master/Slave mode allows a single SlimPAR™ 56 IRC IP unit (the "master") to Mode control the actions of one or more SlimPAR™ 56 IRC IP units (the "slaves") without the need of a DMX controller. Once set and connected, the slave units will operate in unison with the master unit.

### Slave units:

- Press <MENU> repeatedly until 3-CH or 7-CH shows on the display. The slave unit will operate regardless of DMX personality.
- 2. Press **<ENTER>** to accept.
- 3. Set the DMX address to 001.
- 4. Connect the DMX input of the first slave unit to the DMX output of the master unit.
- Connect the DMX input of the subsequent slave units to the DMX output of the previous slave unit.
- 6. Finish setting and connecting all the slave units.


- Set the master unit to operate in Static Color Mode, Automatic or Custom Static Color mode.
- 2. Make the master unit the first unit in the daisy chain.
- Configure all the slave units before connecting the master to the daisy chain.



- Never connect a DMX controller to a DMX string configured for Master/Slave operation because the controller may interfere with the signals from the master unit.
- Do not connect more than 31 slave units to the master unit.

### **IRC (Infrared Remote Control) Operation**

Note: Make sure to point the IRC directly at the receiver on the product.



### **Automatic Mode**

Automatic Mode will enable you to run the automatic programs on the product.

To turn on Automatic Mode:

- 1. Press AUTO on the IRC.
- 2. Press + or to choose between the different auto programs.

To adjust the speed of the automatic program:

- 1. Press SPEED on the IRC.
- Press %.
- 3. Press + or to either increase or decrease the speed of the program.

### Sound-Active Mode (if available)

Sound Active Mode will enable the product to respond to the music.

To turn on Sound Active mode:

1. Press SOUND on the IRC.

To adjust sound sensitivity in Sound Active mode:

- 1. Press SENSITIVITY on the IRC.
- 2. Press %.
- Press + or to either increase or decrease sound sensitivity.

### **Manual Color Control**

To choose a specific color with the IRC:

- 1. Press MANUAL on the IRC.
- 2. Press any number between 0-9 to choose your color.

To manually control the RGB percentage:

- 1. Press MANUAL on the IRC.
- 2. Press R, G, or B to choose your color.
- 3. Press + or to increase or decrease the percentage of each color.

### **Miscellaneous Operation**

To adjust the strobe rate of the program:

- 1. Press STROBE on the IRC.
- 2. Press + or to increase or decrease the strobe rate.
- 3. Press STROBE again to turn off the strobe.

To change the switching effect of the program:

Press FADE/SNAP on the IRC.

Fade will slowly switch the effect. Snap will rapidly switch the effect.

To black out the lights:

Press BLACK OUT on the IRC.

This will turn off all the lights until the button is pressed again.

Note: The IRC will not respond to any inputs when Black Out is activated. If the remote does not respond when a button is pressed, try pressing BLACK OUT. You may have inadvertently activated BLACK OUT.

## 5. TECHNICAL INFORMATION

## Maintenance

Product Dust build up reduces light output performance and can cause overheating. This can lead to reduction of the light source's life. To maintain optimum performance and minimize wear, you should clean your lighting products at least twice a month. However, be aware that usage and environmental conditions could be contributing factors to increase the cleaning frequency.

To clean the product, follow the instructions below:

- Unplug the product from power.
- Wait until the product is cold.
- Use a vacuum (or dry compressed air) and a soft brush to remove dust collected on the external surface/vents.
- Clean all external optics and glass/transparent surfaces with a mild soap solution, ammonia-free glass cleaner, or isopropyl alcohol.
- Apply the solution directly to a soft, lint free cotton cloth or a lens cleaning tissue.
- Softly drag any dirt or grime to the outside of the external optics or glass/transparent surface.
- Gently polish the external optics and glass/transparent surfaces until they are free of haze and lint.



Always dry the external optics and glass/transparent surfaces carefully after cleaning them.
